REFLECTIONS:

AFTER DEATH TO WHERE DID CHRIST DESCEND?

In the Apostles Creed we learn that after Jesus' death "He descended into hell." How could, and why would, the one without sin, the Son of God, Second Person of the Trinity, visit Hell? The confusion lies in the word "Hell", which biblically can represent three different dwellings. Where unrepetant souls spend eternity is referred to as Gehenna, which in Jesus" time was the garbage dump of the city where the corpses of criminals and the carcasses of animals were tossed into the fires. The wind carried the stench of rotting flesh burning in sulfur and brimstone for miles. Jesus spoke of this dumping ground to explain the eternal place of the damned. The second Hell refers to Purgatory, the temporary place where souls are purified before they enter Heaven. In 2 Maccabees 12:44-45, we read: "For if He were not expecting that those who had falled would rise again, it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead. But if He was looking to the splendid reward that is laid up for those who fall asleep in godliness, it was a holy and pious thought. Therefore, He made atonement for the dead, so that they might be delivered from their sin."

In Revelations 21:27: "But nothing unclean will enter it (Heaven), nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life." In 1 Corinthians 14-15, we read: "If what has been built on the foundation survives, the builder will receive a reward. If the work is burned up, the builder will suffer loss; the builder will be saved, but only as through fire."

The third Hell, referred to in the Bible as "the Limbo of the Fathers" and "the bosom of Abraham," no longer exists. It was the waiting place of the righteous who passed away before Christ died on the cross, before He descended there to liberate and deliver them to Heaven. Jesus' death opened the gates of Heaven to worthy human beings. In that Limbo were the good souls from creation to the good thief on the cross.

In the story of Lazarus and the rich man, it is written: "the poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side."

As Christians the waiting is over. The Savior has come and liberated us all. Will we live our lives as He commands or will we foolishly choose to spend our eternity in the burning fields of Hell?

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

I hope all is well with you and your families. This week we will talk about our Need for God. Much of our society's ills I believe can be attributed to a growing movement that dismisses the existence and essentiality of God. Adherents believe humanity can solve the world's problems on its own. They praise science as the end-all-be-all that will provide whatever answers we seek, despite the growing number of scientists who recognize God as the Prime Mover of all things. Buoyed with the defense of separation of church and state, those Americans advocate a sectarian society that litigates against references to God in the contents of the Pledge of Allegiance, the words "in God we trust" on our currency, the inscriptions on public monuments, and against all other and any other references to the Almighty. In a nation where majority rules, we have allowed the loud minority to dictate policy!

There is much truth in the Hamlet of Shakespeare when Hamlet tells his friend, "There are more things in heaven and earth, Horatio, than are dreamt of in your philosphy" (1:5, 167-8). So many get too far ahead of themselves, assigning more self-credit than any of us deserves. They look around at an imperfect world and use that as a reason to prove the absence of God. They choose to believe we are the makers of our own destiny. God, they say, did not make this world; we did. Or it suddenly came to be.

Let's face it: the only thing humanity did was move through history-making decisions that impacted negatively on millions of people for myriad generations. For that we should accept blame. Ulterior motives played themselves out to the detriment of social progress. We have yet to benefit from the rule of the "Philosopher-king" whom Plato said "loves the sight of truth"

We have seen the world led by lesser men whose corrupt power denied truth in the name of greed. <u>Jesus is Truth</u>. Rejecting Him, we can never find in our quest for that immutable certainty the true treasure who calls us to "Ask, and it wil be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you" (Matthew 7:7).
